Seven Pillars – A Vision for Simcoe County

1. A Healthy Environment

All county communities will be sustainable with respect to, among other things, groundwater, surface water, foodland, forests, non-renewable resources, waste management, ecological functions and natural heritage.



2. Agricultural Prosperity

The county will protect its agricultural base to produce quality food to feed Ontarians and the world. Food producers will receive fair compensation for labour, assets and risk. We must maintain and enhance the agricultural enterprise in accordance with sound environment principles.

3. Development that is a Net Benefit to the Community

Current approaches to development and growth must drastically change to stop the destruction of good farmland and our natural heritage. Rapid urban growth is also increasing taxes and utility costs while bringing increased levels of congestion, pollution and resource depletion. New economic policies are urgently needed.

4. Complete Communities

Evolve our communities to provide for the health, social, educational and economic needs of their residents. Such communities will provide a variety of housing in close proximity to employment opportunities, transit, and active transportation and access to recreation and natural areas.

5. Reliable Sustainable Energy

Reliable, sustainable energy will be used as efficiently as possible; the impact of energy production and distribution on air, water, climate, and farmland resources will be minimized; the distribution system will be less centralized; and the proportion of nuclear and fossil-fuel generated energy will be reduced.

6. Awareness of the Need for Sustainability

Decision-makers and the electorate will have a clear understanding of the need for sustainable communities and lifestyles. Decision-makers will therefore be supported in implementing the sometimes challenging policies.

7. Healthy Lifestyles

Communities will be designed to support physical activity and natural heritage appreciation. Planning will support smaller lots, more parks and open spaces, vibrant town centres with shops, restaurants, workplaces and cultural centres nearby.
