<u>January of 2017:</u> Superior Court Justice Frances Kiteley noted that the Compliance Audit matter was developing a <u>life of its own</u> and advised the parties to conference with Associate Chief Justice Marrocco and seek a <u>less expensive and early resolution</u> in May of that year.

<u>Ianuary 2018:</u> Superior Court Justice Ann Molloy noted in her decision that The Compliance Audit Committee <u>misunderstood its role</u> and the Township <u>might intervene</u> if the <u>costs were excessive</u> and of a <u>direct interest</u> to the Township.

March 2016

\* 20 months of delays triggered by McLean and Compliance Audit Committee\*

\*July 2016: McLean application for Judicial Review challenging appointment of Grant Thornton.

\*January 2017: Grant Thornton files motion to dismiss McLean Judicial Review. McLean opposes the motion. Compliance Audit Committee supports McLean's opposition.

\*January 2017: Justice Frances Kiteley rules in favour of Grant Thornton's motion and suggests all parties consider a less expensive resolution and meet with Assistant Chief Justice Frank Marrocco.

\*May 2017: Settlement conference with Justice Marrocco proposing an accelerated process. French and McLean accept proposal, Compliance Audit Committee declines, prolonging the process.

December 2017

December 2017: French Judicial Review is finally heard and dismissed in January 2018.

April 2019: After \$310,000+ spent by Township on matter, prosecutor withdraws all charges against French
