2. Do you feel there is a need to protect water, wetlands and recharge areas from development, aggregate extraction and other intrusive activities in your municipality? If so, how will you achieve this?

I feel that there is a need to protect our water, wetlands and recharge areas from development. We can achieve this by controlling zoning, designating these areas as park lands or public spaces.

3. Ancient deposits under the Simcoe Uplands in Simcoe County's Tiny, Springwater, Oro-Medonte and Tay townships contain pristine groundwater.
